- Academic Session for classes III to V will have assessment as Mid-Term Examination (August) and Annual Examination (February/ March)

 Periodic I and II Papers will be conducted in the months of May and Nov-Dec. respectively.

 (Any change in the schedule will be communicated.)
- Pen/pencil and paper examination will be conducted in classes III-V.
- Regular assessment of a student of classes III-V will be done regularly throughout the academic session as per the weightage of marks given in the table.

Parameters Of Internal Assessment(30 Marks):

1. Attendance Of Student (5 Marks):

2. Subject Enrichment (5 Marks);

These are subject specific application based activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development.

3. Project Based Activities (5 Marks);

These activities facilitate the development of key skills like Identification of Problems, Logical Thinking and Problem Solving in real world.

4. Portfolio (5 Marks):

It is a collection of student's work representing a selection of performances that are assembled over time and describes the student's efforts, progress, growth and achievements in key areas.

5. Multiple Assessments (5 Marks):

It is aimed at evaluating the performance of the student more comprehensively and provide flexibility to use multiple and diverse techniques to assess them.

6. Periodic Tests (5 Marks):

The pattern of Periodic Tests will be same as the Annual Examination. One Periodic Test will be conducted in each term for 20 marks.

Rules Regarding Absence During Examination:

In case of absence during examination, a medical certificate to be submitted within three working days of the date of absence. Otherwise the exam will be considered as willful absence and no mark, credit or allowance will be given for the days of absence. A minimum of 75% attendance is required for the students to be eligible to appear in the Annual Examination.

Promotion Guidelines for class V

Passing Criteria For Class V

In order to be declared "Pass" at the end of the session for promotion to the next higher class, a student must secure at least 33% marks in each subject studied by him/ her during the session. He/ she must secure overall 33% marks ie. 33 marks out of 100 [Marks of the attendance of the student (5 marks) plus marks of Subject Enrichment (5 marks) plus marks

of Project Based Activities (5 marks) plus marks of Portfolio (05 marks) plus marks of Multiple assessment (05 marks) plus marks of Unit Test/ Periodic Test (5 marks) plus marks of Mid Term Exam (20 marks) and Annual Examination (50 marks) put together].

The promotion to the next higher class is also subject to the condition that a minimum of 25% of marks must be scored in Mid Term Examination plus Annual Examination ie. 18

marks out of 70 in each subject.

• Grace Marks up to maximum of 10 marks in total (not more than 5 marks in one subject) shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in each subject provided that a minimum of 25% marks are secured in each subject in Annual Examination and that he/she does not require more than 05 marks in one subject to come up to the minimum requirement of 33% marks in that subject.

Re Examination For Class V

- A candidate who appears in Annual Examination can be declared eligible for appearing in the Re-Examination in all the failing subject(s) held within a period of two months from the date of declaration of the result.
- In order to be declared "Pass" in Re Examination, a student will have to secure at least 25% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Re Examination ie. 18 marks out of 70 provided that a minimum of 33 marks are secured in total in the subject.

• No benefit of the grace marks will be given to the students appearing in the Re-Examination for the promotion to the next higher class.

Criteria for Essential Repeat

• If a student does not secure at least 25% marks in the subject(s) in which he/she has taken the Re – Examination and minimum of 33 out of 100 marks in that subject(s) or does not appear in the Re – Examination, he/ she will be placed in the category of "Essential Repeat" (ER).

A student of class V who is **not eligible for Pass**, Promotion and placed in the category of "Essential Repeat" (ER) will be held back in the same class during the next session.
